


Route 6 – Circular Route (Nuptown)



Please take care as this route involves walking along country lanes with few footpaths.

Please take care when crossing the A330 Ascot Road.

Leave the car park by Wellers Lane and turn right.

Follow Wellers Lane past Drowned Boy Pond to the junction with the A 330.

Cross straight over into Snipes Lane and continue to the junction with Hawthorn Lane.

Turn right and within a few yards take the footpath to your left through the metal kissing gate. You are now in Ashmore Lane, one of the prettiest Lanes in the Borough and particularly worth a visit at Bluebell time. You are on the northern fringe of both the Parish and Borough boundary.

Follow the path until the junction with Hog Oak Lane. Turn Right and follow the track past the nature reserve, until it joins a tarmac road, Bishops Lane. You are now in Nuptown.

Turn right and follow the tarmac road round to the left into Nuptown Lane. (If you want to take a shorter route do not turn left but keep straight on back into Hawthorn Lane. You will re-join the route at the junction with Berry Lane.)

Follow Nuptown Lane and take the first on your right, Berry Lane. It is one of very few uphill climbs in the area!

You will re-join Hawthorn Lane at the top. Turn left and follow Hawthorn Lane back past the start of Ashmore Lane and the end of Snipes Lane, continue past Fernygrove farm shop and café to the junction with the A330 Ascot Road.

Cross straight over into Penfurzen Lane and continue to the junction with Wellers Lane at the Jealotts Hill Community Landshare.

Turn right and return to Frost Folly Park
